## I. Oral Presentations (Let's Give a Presentation in English)

- 1) Time allocated to your presentation:7 minutes presentation, without Q&A.

  The international commentators will provide feedback and encouragement for 2 minutes following your presentation.
- 2) Speakers will be reminded one minute before the end of their allotted time with a yellow lamp, then with a red lamp at the end.
- 3) Please bring your computer or data storage device (USB memory stick) to the PC Preview Center (the Basement 2nd floor at International Conference Center Hiroshima) at least 30 minutes before your scheduled presentation time to allow the PC operator to check the operation.
- 4) Please be seated in the next speaker's seat (in the front left side of the venue) at least 10 minutes before the start of your presentation.

- 8) Notes for speakers with their own computers.
  - $\circ$  Remember to bring your own laptop, power adaptor, and cables.
  - Our computers must be equipped with HDMI or a Dsub-15 pin video output. Please bring conversion cables if necessary.
  - Please turn off the screensaver and power saving mode.
  - Laptops will be returned from a PC operator near the podium in each session room after the presentation.
